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
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Welcome, friend!

I am so delighted you chose to lead a group through HAGAR: Rediscovering the God Who Sees Me. May the Lord richly bless you and your group as you journey through the study!

Whether you have been leading Bible study groups for years or this is your first time, the greatest gift each of us brings to those God entrusts to our care is our support, love, and encouragement – and for these, there is no prerequisite. Nevertheless, this Leader Guide offers some helpful tips and resources to equip you as you prepare to lead your group.

I am honored to partner with you and excited for all God has in mind to do in you and through you!

Before You Begin

A few items to consider as you plan your group:

- Invite a team of prayer supporters to come alongside you and cover you, your coleaders, and the participants in prayer.
- Encourage your group facilitators to reach out to each participant weekly to let them know they are being prayed over.
- Schedule time with your group facilitators prior to the start of each meeting to pray.
- Familiarize yourself with the About the Study and Group Study Tips pages in the book (these pages are also included in this Leader Guide).





Have you ever prayed, "God, Do You See Me?"

The answer is Yes! God has so much to teach us through Hagar's story, and I can hardly wait for us to begin our journey of HAGAR: Rediscovering the God Who Sees Me.

The study book is divided into seven weeks, each comprised of five days of personal study. For added flexibility, participants can choose a commitment level that works best for them: "light", "moderate", "in-depth" or "all-in". See enclosed **Group Study Tips** for more details.

Each day of study includes one or more questions suitable for **Group Discussion**. These questions are followed by a . Be sure not to overlook these questions, even if you are working through the material on your own. There are also **Pause to Ponder** sections throughout the study; these are designed to provide you with a time of personal reflection. Use the space in the margin (or, if you prefer, a journal or notebook) to respond to these questions. For readers desiring to dig even deeper, I've prepared **Extra** questions, which are preceded by a ...

At the end of each day, there is a **Your Turn** section for personal application. These questions are important. While studying the Bible can stir our hearts and open our eyes to wonderful truths, only when we apply what we have learned will it have a lasting impact for God's kingdom.

About This Study

During my study of **HAGAR**, I often found myself fascinated by secondary topics related to the material. The **Supplemental Readings** I included throughout the study are not essential, but you may find them enjoyable and informative.

One quick note: some paraphrase versions of the Bible may be inadequate for the purposes of this study. Whenever possible, it is recommended that you complete the exercises using a Bible translation that adheres to a more literal translation, such as the English Standard Version, New American Standard Bible, New King James Version, or King James Version.

Before you begin, take a few moments to ask the Holy Spirit to guide you over the next seven weeks and to bless your commitment to this study. Then, as you open your Bible and your heart, begin each day with an eager expectation of *Rediscovering the God Who Sees Me*.





WHAT TO BRING

- Bible Study books

GROUP ETIQUETTE GUIDELINES

- Commitment Participants are expected to make attending all group sessions a priority.
- Respect As a non-judgmental God-honoring group, please recognize that
 participants may have different opinions and religious backgrounds.
- Considerate Please do not interrupt another person while they are speaking, or try to analyze, "fix", or offer advice, as this can interrupt or hinder their spiritual journey. This may be the first time they have found the courage to share; give them space to do so.
- Time Be sensitive to the time and leave room for each person to share; do
 not monopolize the conversation.
- **Healthy Environment** No alcohol or other substances that may hinder your ability to fully participate in the group. Silence cell phones.
- Confidentiality All participants agree to keep the information discussed within the group confidential.
- Arrive on Time Be considerate of each another's time; please arrive on time.



FIRST MEETING

- Distribute books; assign participants to their individual tables/groups
- Welcome the group and share an opening prayer
- Commend participants for attending and for making the time to invest in their walk with God when so many other things compete for their time
- Introduce yourself and share what led you to serve as leader/co-leader (invite other co-leaders and facilitators to do the same)
- Around the Tables: have participants introduce themselves and share one thing they hope to gain from your time together
- Watch first video (see Video Sessions Guide, included in this Leader Guide, for session times)
- Review About the Study page with the group
- Review Group study Tips page, particularly the Customized Commitments options
 where participants can choose one of four commitment levels
- Go over class schedule
- Optional: invite someone in the group to read A Note from the Author in the study book
- Optional: Review Group Etiquette Guidelines with the group
- Ask group if there are any questions
- Closing Prayer

SUBSEQUENT MEETING

- Welcome the group
- Review and discuss the assigned homework (suggestion: begin with one of the
 Group Discussion questions within the assigned reading)
- After reviewing all of the scheduled assignments, ask participants if they wish to discuss any questions that were skipped or something from the homework that stood out to them
- If a video session is scheduled, watch the video after group discussion. Use the blank **NOTES** pages in the Bible study book for note-taking during the video.
- Discuss what was presented in the video or any final thoughts
- Closing Prayer

LAST MEETING

- Party! (Potluck, Taco bar, Popcorn, Coffee bar . . .)
- Open Mic: invite participants to share a key "aha" moment or takeaway from the study
- Celebrate their completed commitment to finish the study and any answered prayers
- Closing prayer



Because any deep work of God requires a sacrifice of time spent in His Word and in His presence, the volume of material in an in-depth study can be challenging for some participants. For this reason, several suggestions are provided to help you facilitate the study when participants have varying levels of time constraints.

CONSIDER AN EXTENDED SCHEDULE

Rather than meeting for seven weeks, consider using the extended **Class Schedule** (included in this guide). This extended schedule gives participants two weeks of time to complete each Week in the study, allowing participants to dive deeper into the material without feeling overwhelmed.

CUSTOMIZED COMMITMENTS

If you are meeting for seven weeks, the following page provides suggested assignments based on an individual's time constraints.

However, if your group is using the extended **Class Schedule**, the time commitments on the following page would be cut in half. For example, under the extended schedule, those who chose the **MODERATE** commitment level can anticipate spending roughly 15 minutes a day on the written assignments, rather than 30 minutes using a seven week schedule.





ALL PARTICIPANTS:

- Read through each day's material, including the assigned Bible passages
- Optional: read the Supplemental Reading section as provided in various weeks

In addition to the above assignments for All Participants, each participant can choose one of the following commitment levels:

LIGHT (15 minutes a day)

- Complete the Your Turn personal application section at the end of each day
- o If you have time, complete the Group Discussion questions identified with a Off-

MODERATE (30 minutes a day)

- Complete the various Pause to Ponder personal reflection sections as well as the Your Turn personal application section at the end of each day
- o Complete the **Group Discussion** questions identified with a officer

IN-DEPTH (45 minutes a day)

Complete all questions except for the Extra questions identified with a



ALL IN (60 minutes a day)

- o Complete all questions, including the Extra questions identified with a
- o Read the **Supplemental Reading** as provided in various weeks



While the study is divided into seven weeks, an extended class schedule can be helpful whereby each Week in the study is completed over two weeks of time. NOTE: Except for the Introductory Video Session, videos serve as a wrap up to the previous Week of study as well as introduction to the next Week of study; therefore, while not required, it is recommended to begin class with group discussion followed by watching the video.

Watch Introductory Session before you begin. Watch Video Session 1 after completing Week One in the study (same for Video Sessions 2-7).

INTRODUCTORY SESSION: God, do You see me? Every human heart asks this question. Watch Shadia's powerful introduction to Hagar's story. You'll laugh, you'll ponder precious truths, and you'll rejoice in the reminder that the Almighty Ruler of the universe is also the intimate "God Who Sees Me." 16 minutes

SESSION ONE: Through captivating dramatizations, Shadia traces Hagar's origins through the story of Abraham and Sarah. Could a disastrous detour into Egypt actually be a part of God's sovereign plan? In this session, viewers will discover that God is always present – even in the detours. **20 minutes**

SESSION TWO: Shadia shows the depths of God's compassion through the eyes of a runaway slave. Used, abused, barefoot and pregnant, Hagar flees into the desert and comes face to face with the God Who Sees Me. **26 minutes**

SESSION THREE: In this session, Shadia teaches how to rest on God's promises when your world is falling apart. Though Ishmael is not the promised child, God blesses Hagar's son, but a greater trial awaits . . . **21 minutes**

SESSION FOUR: Witness God's power and plan as Shadia explores Hagar and Ishmael's banishment into the wilderness. The place where God displays His mercy and invites Hagar into His holy work.

19 minutes

SESSION FIVE: Tracing the events in Genesis 22, Shadia teaches the value in surrendering to God's plan for your future. The same God who saw Hagar's suffering in the wilderness is the same God who will provide a solution to an even greater need. **21 minutes**

SESSION SIX: Examine the beauty and power of God's ultimate gift: the sacrifice of His Son. Just as we identify with Hagar's suffering, Jesus identifies with ours. Why did He do it? What did He see? Shadia answers this question and more in this powerful session. **23 minutes**

SESSION SEVEN: In this final session, Shadia reveals that Hagar is not forgotten. In fact, she was victorious! In the same way, if we define the turning points of our lives not by the tragedies, but by the triumphs, we will discover that our trials serve a magnificent purpose: to draw us into the loving arms of El Roi, the *God Who Sees Me.* **24 minutes**



Why Did You Create Four Commitment levels?

Group Leaders face a common challenge: balancing members who want minimal homework with those hungry for deeper study. Most Bible studies cater to a lower commitment level, leaving those who love to dig deep unsatisfied. My Four Commitment approach removes this tension entirely—those with demanding schedules can participate meaningfully without pressure, while Bible study enthusiasts can dive as deep as they want. From busy newcomers to seasoned Bible lovers, all can enjoy a rich experience where no one feels left out or left wanting.
